## ESTONIAN RELIGIOUS LITERATURE PUBLISHED IN THE ESTONIAN LANGUAGE DURING THE PERIOD 1945—1968

Published for, or under the auspices of, the Estonian Evangelical Lutheran Church (EELK). The following bibliographical survey lists the English translations of the titles. It might be added that the Estonian Evangelical Lutheran Church is spread all over the western world and has 67 congregations with a total of 80,000 members being refugees.

The present survey starts with publications of the Evangelical Lutheran Church (ELK) existing in Soviet Estonia with 175 congregations and 300,000 members against more than 800,000 in 1943.

The name of the Lutheran Church in the Independent Republic of Estonia was "The Estonian Evangelical Lutheran Church" or "Eesti Evangeeliumi Luteriusu Kirik" (EELK). During the second Soviet occupation of Estonia in 1944 the word, Estonia, was deleted resulting in "The Evangelical Lutheran Church" (ELK). This act resembled the prevailing conditions under the Tsars in Russia for at that time the said church was called "The Evangelical Lutheran Church in Russia". In conjunction with the plans for attaining membership in The Lutheran World Federation and The World Council of Churches the name, "The Estonian Evangelical Lutheran Church" (EELK), was adopted for use outside of Estonia while the name, "The Evangelical Lutheran Church" (ELK), was to remain for domestic use. The point was to have as many votes as possible in the World Council of Churches in favor of the Kremlin.

A church in exile, widely displaced and in tire need, maintain contact with its members by means of printed material which, during a period of 23 years, has reached a production as indicated above.

The same church, in Soviet Estonia, has been forced to declare that it is free. This same church has in fact only managed to publish a single book: for propaganda abroad.

The eminently hostile and intolerant power, which keeps a church split into two factions, also makes it impossible to meet the real need for religious literature, as it is forbidden to receive these books in Soviet.
